Phonics is recommended as the first strategy taught in helping children learn to read. It runs alongside other teaching methods such as guided reading and shared reading to help children develop vital reading skills and a love of reading.

At St Jude and St Paul's, we deliver most of our phonics through Letters and Sounds and Jolly Phonics supported by PhonicsPlay and Phonics Bug.
