News Around the Classes

Year 6

Year 6 had a great trip to the Stephen Wiltshire exhibition. They did their daily mile in the park and then were inspired to do their own drawings of buildings along the Thames.

They have been redrafting and editing their exciting stories for their writing assessments. Well done to all those who are now using colons and semi-colons, correct speech punctuation and different length sentences for effect.

Year 4

This week in Year 4 we have been writing our own Roman Myths featuring the Gods and Goddesses. We have also been looking at how the Roman army conquered Britain and what life was like as a legionary.

In maths, we have been studying the properties of 2D shapes, learning the different types of triangles, including equilateral, isosceles and scalene. Quiz us at the weekend!

Year 5

Year 5 have been studying 3D shapes. We have learned to use a range of mathematical vocabulary to describe 3D shapes and have learned to visualize 3D shapes from 2D representational drawings.

In English, we analysed biography and autobiography writing. We identified features of a biography and we have also revised the layout and punctuation of speech.

Year 3

This week in Maths we revisited 2D and 3D shapes. We learned the proper names for 4, 5 and 6 sided shapes. We also learned some new vocabulary 'face', 'edge' and 'vertex' to describe the properties of 3D shapes. In English, we have done lots of writing. We firstly wrote about a setting which had a lively, happy mood. We then thought about how easily language can change the mood, and so wrote about the same setting but with a dangerous, threatening mood. Our short stories are amazing and will hopefully be on display soon for you to read.

Year 2

This week, Year 2 have been practising telling the time and identifying and changing features of The Gingerbread Man.

On Thursday, we all went to Market Road to take part in a football tournament with several schools from Islington. The boys played four games against some very tough competition and managed to draw one. The girls' team managed to win 3 of their 5 games!

Year 1

In Year One this week, we have been practising to read some of the many labels we have in the classroom. Then we walked around the class to find something to label ourselves, from Sammy Squirrel and Oscar Owl (our puppets) to cubes, rulers and pencils. In Maths, we have been practising to say all the different ways we can make five and adding different numbers up to ten, using cubes. We have begun work on recognising the Earth with its water and land and some of its continents. We enjoyed taking part in the Harvest Festival, especially singing the Harvest songs.

Year Reception

What an exciting week in Reception. We have started our amazing reading journey, blending sounds together during our phonics sessions. In maths, we are continuing to count objects and actions and are learning to recognise numbers up to 100 - please point out numbers on buses, doors, etc, when you are out and about with your child. We had our first trip out of school together on Thursday, joining the rest of the school for the Harvest festival at the Church. Next week, we will be talking about babies. Please could you bring in a photo of your child when they were a baby?
