La Grande Jatte, Bathers at Asnières, The Circus


Style/Period: Pointillism, Neo-impressionist




Seurat painted in a style called *pointillism*, which was made up of many tiny dots.





Here are couple of picture for you could colour on or down load your own and paint in the style of Seurat.





Describe what you see in the picture.

Pointillism is a way of painting that painters came up with in the 1800s. They used tiny dots of color instead of brush strokes. When small dots of different colors are next to each other the eye blends them together when they are looked at from a distance. Paint a square of one color and then

add small dots of a different color on top of it to make different shades.

OINTILLISM

The painting below is called *La Grande Jatte*. It was painted by a French painter named George Seurat in the 1800s. It was one of the first paintings to use pointillism. Try coloring in the lady from the painting in the same style. See if you can add some background colors too!
